LEADERSHIP BOARD

March's ministry team spotlight is on the **Building Maintenance** team. Grateful for this team for without them, our building (inside and out) would not be nearly as beautiful! Thank you Bill Almy for the info below!

The maintenance team has a broad range of responsibilities, from electrical, carpentry, plumbing, landscaping and anything else that falls between these particular areas. We have a maintenance schedule in place for each month for items that tend to be seasonal, for example, installing the portable air condition units in the pastor's office and secretary's office in the spring months and removing them in the fall. In addition, our monthly schedule may include (but not limited to) start-up and shutdown of boilers, checking smoke alarms, emergency exit lights and clocks for needed maintenance. In the spring and summer months, the team concentrates on both the church and parsonage property, for needed maintenance, such as trees, shrubs, lawn, painting, power washing, fence and deck repair.

The church has a work order process in place that helps identify repair needs as they pop up. This process helps stay on top of care and maintenance for the interior and exterior of the church building. We also support the maintenance needs for the special community programs that work within our church like, Community Food Bank, 2nd Thursday Meals Program, the Soup Project and Back-Packs-for Bellies.

We are blessed to have a loyal team of volunteers that dedicate their time and resources at keeping God's house in good condition. The team consists of:


