

Before Covid the "First" Thursday Dinner was created to feed families who came to the Food Bank. Families were able to enjoy a meal at the church and shop at the Food Bank on the same evening. After Covid, we brainstormed how this ministry could be revamped to start again. After some prayer and discussion, Linda Sandborn and I felt that God was leading us to deliver meals once a month to people in our church. It had been on our hearts even before Covid. We went through the church directory to start of list of persons who lived alone, were not able to get out or who were ill and needed extra help. Pastor Tish also offered names of those just home from the hospital, those who had welcomed a new baby, or who were suffering in some way. Our average number of deliveries each month has been 28 meals.

After a few months we decided to offer others in the church a chance to help by either donating time or food to the ministry. We moved the date to the "Second" Thursday Dinner, and it's been a delight to get to know those who help run the ministry and those who receive the food that is prepared and donated.
