# What are You Waiting For?

What are you waiting for? I've been asked that question many times in my life. Sometimes the answer came quickly and simply, and other times, not so much. We are beginning the season of waiting, of anticipation, of Advent. Advent is the four weeks leading up to Christmas; the period of time that we set aside to consider what it means to wait, to consider what the

people of Israel were waiting for, to consider what we are waiting for here and now. Each week has a focus: hope, peace, joy, and love. I will be asking you what it means to wait with hope, to find peace and joy in the waiting, to know that love is found throughout the period of waiting. Finally, that all of these things are manifested in the coming of that tiny baby, the coming of our Lord and Savior, the coming of Christ.

And so, for now, we wait. We wait just as the people of Israel waited all those years ago to be freed from the bonds of oppression. We wait just as those shepherds did, watching over their flock with care. We wait just as Elizabeth and Zechariah waited through years of infertility to finally have a son, John. We wait just as Anna and Simeon waited at the temple, praying for a savior to come, and finally seeing it come to pass. We wait just as those Wisemen waited for years, anticipating the moment that the stars would align, and finally making their way to worship the toddler that was Jesus. We wait just as Mary waited-waited for the moment the birth pains would begin, waited for the moment the son of God would be born through her, waited for the moment that Jesus would begin his ministry here on earth, waited for the moment that she would see her son die so that we may be reborn. And now, we wait. We wait with hopeful anticipation. We wait with peace in our hearts and in our minds. We wait with exuberant joy. We wait, overflowing with love-the love that was found within that tiny baby all hose years ago. Amen.


in Faith We are going to be selling fudge and other Christmas
