Greetings PUMC!

Can I just say, I love our new 'Love-Your-Neighbor' Team here at PUMC! I love the enthusiasm of the team as they listen to the Spirit and creatively plan new events to share love in the world. I love the heart of this church that seeks to love on our neighbors in so many different ways. I love the spirit of the congregation that rises to meet each new challenge to love – donating tissues and

cleaning wipes to our schools, bottled water and granola bars for young athletes, spending time with seniors playing BINGO and spreading the word about the new suicide prevention number 988, just to name a few. I love how you love God, one another, and our community. That's a lot of love!!!

As United Methodists this kind of love for neighbor is no surprise. Our heritage is one of compassion, loving neighbor, and social justice. This stuff is in our denominational DNA. Retired UMC pastor, Rev. Jack Harnish, summarizes this well:

On April 4, 1742, Charles Wesley preached a sermon in Oxford which would become his signature sermon. It was called **Awake! Thou That Sleepest** and was based on Ephesians 5:14. It was printed as a tract then circulated throughout the Methodist class meetings. I guess that makes Brother Charles the first **Woke Methodist**.

Charles' famous sermon was a call to come alive spiritually, to awake from the lethargy and lack of faith which plagued the church in his day, but that spiritual revival resulted in an incredible social awakening as well. The Wesley's believed warm-hearted, spiritually alive Christians were called to deal with issues like child labor, slavery, prison reform and poverty. As Methodist theologian Leonard Sweet says, Jesus didn't just come to make a difference in the world, he came to make a different world. And so did the Wesleys.

Today the word woke is used by some as a derogatory term of mocking derision. Well, so was the name Methodist. The Wesley brother's fellow students at Oxford made fun of them by calling them Bible Moths and Methodists because they were so methodical in

LEADERSHIP BOARD: CHILDREN'S MINISTRY HIGHLIGHT

God is moving in our church as evidenced by growth in these areas! We have had growth in both the Seedlings Nursery and The Neighborhood Sunday School. Nursery regularly has 5 kids, and Sunday school has 11 kids. Please take a second to read about a day in the life of these ministries from Mary Bresnahan:

In Nursery, the kids play with books and toys and sometimes work on a craft. They also work on the ABC's coloring page. The ABC's coloring page is not just ABC's, for example B is for Bible, C is for Christ, and so on and so forth. We have toys in the nursery for our littlest ones through preschool! Our nursery workers are patient and energetic, and they do a wonderful job of teaching the children the Love of Jesus. We are looking for more help in this area! We are looking for someone that would like to volunteer the first Sunday of the month.

In Sunday School, we have a curriculum that follows the church calendar. Right now we are learning about parables, and if you ask the students what a parable is they will be able to tell you. Our lessons contain a short video and follow up questions that are age appropriate and can be adjusted for individual students since we have a wide range of ages. Recently, we learned about the Sower and the seed. We asked them what the seeds represented, and then we discussed ways we can "plant seeds" outside of church. The kids had some great ideas about planting seeds and sharing God's love. We followed up with a craft where we planted real glower seeds that the kids could take home and water. We are still looking for helpers for the Neighborhood ministry as well.

We have a lot of fun in both the Seedlings Nursery and in The Neighborhood. It is wonderful to watch the kids grow and really get to know about Jesus's love for us all. Not only is our Ministry growing, but my hope is also that Susan, Brandon, and I will have one Sunday a month away from teaching to attend church. The volunteers will always have one of us three in the room with them and will not be asked to teach the lesson. We are aware that it will be separate Sunday's that we attend church.

If you are interested in volunteering for either the Nursery or the Sunday School, reach out to me, Mary Bresnahan at 517-526-7571, or I will be upstairs on Sundays. Stop in and check out the classrooms and see how much fun we have nurturing the future of the church.

As Mary mentions above, this ministry needs more volunteers. Our goal is to get Mary, Brandon and Susan a week off each month so they can attend in person service and be rejuvenated! Please prayerfully consider giving of your time by supporting our youngest worshippers!




